

BALTIC MINICUP 2020

International electric and mototrial competition series for children

Regulation

1. Goals and tasks

The goals of the “Baltic MINICUP 2020 ”competition series are:

- To popularize mototrial as an accessible and environmental friendly sport;
- To develop children's motorcycle interest in the Baltic States with electric motorcycles and internal combustion engines;
- Promote opportunities for leisure activities for families with children;
- To develop cooperation in motorcycle races;
- Involve young Baltic trial riders.

This serie of competitions is registered in the competition calendars of the Baltic Motor Federations as a “C” category competition. The rules of LaMSF, Sports Code, the Code of Ethics and the Estonian or Latvian trial rules apply to the competition series, unless it’s stated otherwise. The licensed judges by the competition country will be directed to the competition after the organizer has previously consulted the rules.

Additional rules will be prepared, published and distributed to the participating clubs at least one month before the competition.

2. Participants and classes

<i>Class</i>	<i>Age</i>	<i>Minimum number of tracks, repetitions</i>
Mini C	Children up to 12 years old on a motorcycle with an electric or internal combustion engine (up to 80cc)	Minimum 5 tracks, 2 repetitions without time limit
Mini B	Children up to 12 years old on a motorcycle with an electric or internal combustion engine (up to 80cc)	Minimum 5 tracks, 3 repetitions without time limit
Mini A	Children up to 12 years old on a motorcycle with an electric or internal combustion engine (up to 80cc)	Minimum 5 tracks, 3 repetitions without time limit
Dip Dap	Children on a balance bike, no age limit	Minimum 5 tracks, 2 repetitions without time limit

* Classification by difficulty level: “Mini A” (Hard), “Mini B” (Medium), “Mini C” (Light). The maximum age limit is 12 years (i.e., born in 2007, will be 12 in 2019).

3. Licence and participation fee

Licenses: Competing is allowed with a national license. Competitors who do not have an annual license can purchase a one-time license from the competition.

Insurance: Competitors are required to have an insurance policy for accidents in motorsport competitions. License and insurance are not required for the Dip Dap class.

Participation fee: The participation fee is 10.- euros per competitor per stage.

4. Results and awards

Individual results:

- **Each competitor is a winner and everyone will receive an award from the organizer in the award ceremony.**
- At each stage, the results are determined, i.e. points are calculated individually according to the rules. The scoreboard is published on results.trial.ee to provide information to .
- The instructor can help the child by holding the rear fender, but in this case 5 penalty points apply immediately. The time for passing the track is specified by the secretary.
- The instructor does not have to wear a helmet.
- Competitors who have participated at least 4 stages will receive an invitation to season ending event where participants will receive a diploma and medal for their participation. Season summary scoreboard and the results will not be made public.

Club results:

- During the season, the participating clubs will compete for the title of “Baltic Minicup”. At each stage, the club's competitor earns points for the club as follows: the best in his/her class gives his club as many points as there are competitors in his/her class. For example:

1. place	2. place	3. place	4. place	5. place	6. place	Etc.
6 points	5 points	4 points	3 points	2 points	1 point	Etc.

- The club with the most points in all classes wins the season.

5. Security and liability

- Each competitor must have an instructor who is responsible for the young rider and assists if necessary. The instructor will be registered in the secretariat on the competition morning.
- First aid must be available in accordance with regulations.
- When confirming a child for the competition, the person is responsible for the child withdraws from any protests against the organizer, after accidents or other incidents that could be brought to court.
- Photographing, filming and publication of the results of the competition is allowed only after informing the organizer. If a competitor is registered , it will be confirmed with the signature, that means the competitor may be photographed and filmed during the competition.
- The organizer is not responsible if the competitors are not aware of or do not follow these rules.
